Additional Uniform Requirements

It would be unusual circumstances where a student does not wear full school uniform. An accompanying letter or email from a parent/guardian is requested to explain the circumstances. As a Sun Smart School, the school hat must be worn to and from school, and when participating in outdoor activities.

- 1) Fingernail polish and make-up may not be worn to school.
- 2) Hair longer than collar length must be worn tied back/up with dark green, navy or natural hair coloured accessories. Hair needs to be of a length that does not obstruct or distract the eyes. Natural hair colour only is acceptable. Hair razor cuts may be no shorter than a 3 blade. Razor tracks, mullets, mohawks, rats tails and other similar styles are not permitted. Hair should be neat and tidy and not of a design that would attract attention.

- 3) No decorative jewellery other than a simple cross or religious icon with a chain may be worn at school. A digital or analogue watch may be worn. Please see Personal Device Policy for more specific information regarding acceptable watches that can be worn.
- 4) One small sleeper/stud earring may be worn in each ear. Choices should be restricted to small plain silver/gold hoops or studs.
- 6) It would be unusual circumstances when a student does not wear full school uniform, including the school hat. An accompanying letter or email from a parent/guardian is requested to explain the circumstances.
